Summary of the Project

This Australian Learning and Teaching Council (ALTC) funded project aims to encourage and support program coordinators and directors of Australian undergraduate and postgraduate health profession degrees to include ehealth (or 'clinical informatics') curriculum where it is not yet in place. Degrees include all allied health, nursing and medical professions.

The project will take a coordinated national approach. Between now and December 2012 we will be working with academics across Australia to investigate, to workshop and to disseminate a variety of options for curriculum renewal for ehealth capability in clinical health professional degrees. The project will also draw on international perspectives on ehealth education given that many of our graduates are employed internationally. Curriculum will be addressed in the broad sense of themes and topics, learning and teaching methods, assessment and accreditation processes.

The project received ethics approval on the 12th of May 2011. The project team will soon be launching the first of three surveys. The online survey will be sent to program coordinators and directors of health degree programs in academic institutions.

The aim of survey 1 is to get a snapshot of present practices in ehealth education in health profession degrees. The aim of survey 2 is to identify interprofessional opportunities and challenges in clinical informatics education. The aim of survey 3 is to evaluate the impact of project activities and assess further resources required to drive curriculum renewal.
